

Community Garden Meeting Notes from Patty

No, I do not have a date yet as to when the gardens will be open. Mother Nature will determine that.

After the soil dries enough to mark off with stakes, I will put numbers on the stakes on the WEST outer edge of your plot. If it is not a split plot, the southwest corner will be marked. Your plot will be directly east of the plot marker.

NO ONE is allowed to go into the gardens to plant their plots until the stakes are up and marked with numbers.

Water will be available, but please bring your own containers to carry it back to your plot. We have a couple of carts available, but they are becoming dilapidated.

There are some stakes available for your use on the South Edge of the garden by the garden shed.

PLEASE BE A GOOD GARDENER AND NEIGHBOR.

DO NOT plant in the area next to the roadways outside your garden plots. This area must be maintained by each of you- keep weeds down so the large mower can come through those areas in the summer.

DO NOT place rocks on the edges of your plots...the mower will hit them. If you find rocks, please put them in the roadway ruts.

DO NOT plant corn or any tall plantings on the garden edges next to your neighbor...this will shade out their plantings.

DO NOT plant closer than 2 FEET from the edge between plots...there will be no room for you or your neighbor to walk into their plots along the edges.

DO NOT leave garden equipment at the garden plots unattended...the Community Garden will not be responsible if anything is stolen.

DO NOT leave behind garden pots and landscape fabric OR any other sticks or wires used as plant supports or markers at the end of the season.

If you see any issues with any of the water tanks...leaking etc., please contact me at the Extension office at 920-929-3172.

Garden stakes near the shed and port-a-potty need to be sorted out and used or taken out of the garden. If there are branch stakes that were placed by the sheds, please use them or take them home.

PLEASE clean up any garbage in or near your plots and take it home for your garbage pick-up.

The revised date for a plot refund will be extended through June 15th in the event of possible excess moisture conditions.

PLEASE REMOVE all string and twine from stakes after your plot lines have been established. Many stakes still have twine on them when they are removed at the end of the season...YOU MUST TAKE IT OFF!
