- 101 Cake Decorating Basics** **Presenter: Makayla and Maureen Demler**
Hands on learning to basic fundamental to cake decorating. Participants will depart the session with general knowledge which will aid in success of future projects **(All ages)**
- 102 Ladybugs and Tadpoles Tic-Tac-Toe** **Presenter: Katie Gierach**
We will be creating a tic-tac-toe game with a log painted as a pond and rocks painted as tadpoles and ladybugs. This makes a great project to take to the fair. **(All Ages)**

- 108 Photography Basics** **Presenter: Roxanne Abler**
This course will help you discover the basics of photography. You'll learn terms like focal point, composition, focus, and how to create more interesting photos by using light, color, perspectives, and other simple techniques. We'll discuss a little about the photography project in 4-H and how to enter your photos into the fair. Parents are encouraged to sit in with younger members, especially those who are entering their first year in the photography project. Bring a notebook & pen. Class is taught by a professional photographer. **(Ages 8 and up)**
- 109 Macramé a Bracelet** **Presenters: Pam Bartoli and Cassie Burke**
Learn how to macramé and make a beautiful bracelet at the same time. **(Ages: 9 and up)**
- 110 Sharpie Art** **Presenters: Makayla and Sharon Stommel**
You will be creating a tie dye hat using Sharpie markers and rubbing alcohol. You can also create a suncatcher made out of a water bottle and colored with Sharpie markers. If you have favorite Sharpie marker colors from home you can bring them (no ultra-fine point), otherwise markers, hat, and suncatcher will be provided. **(All Ages)**

- 201 Launching into Rocketry** **Presenters: Kaitlyn Wehner and Steven Schlosser Jr.**
Have you ever wanted to learn how to build a model rocket? You will get your own rocket kit to build and take home! **(Ages 9 and up)**
- 202 Intermediate Photography – Introduction to Manual Mode** **Presenter: Roxanne Abler**
This is a more advanced class for those who already understand the basics of photography and are interested in learning how to take your camera off the "auto" mode and learn how to get a better, more creative image using manual settings on a DSLR camera (a camera that has interchangeable lenses). Participants should either already own a DSLR camera or be thinking about buying one (bring it along if you have one!). We'll discuss how to get better focus, using light for proper exposure, and learn photography terms such as shutter speed, aperture, ISO, and more. We'll briefly discuss Photoshop and editing. This course is strictly for high-school age and up. Class is taught by a professional photographer. **(Ages 14 and up)**

- 203 Wildlife: Indoor – Outdoor - Anywhere** **Presenters: Norb and Barb Yogerst .**

Learn about pets while making a Pet Puppet and participating in a Pet Parade! **(Ages: Cloverbuds)**

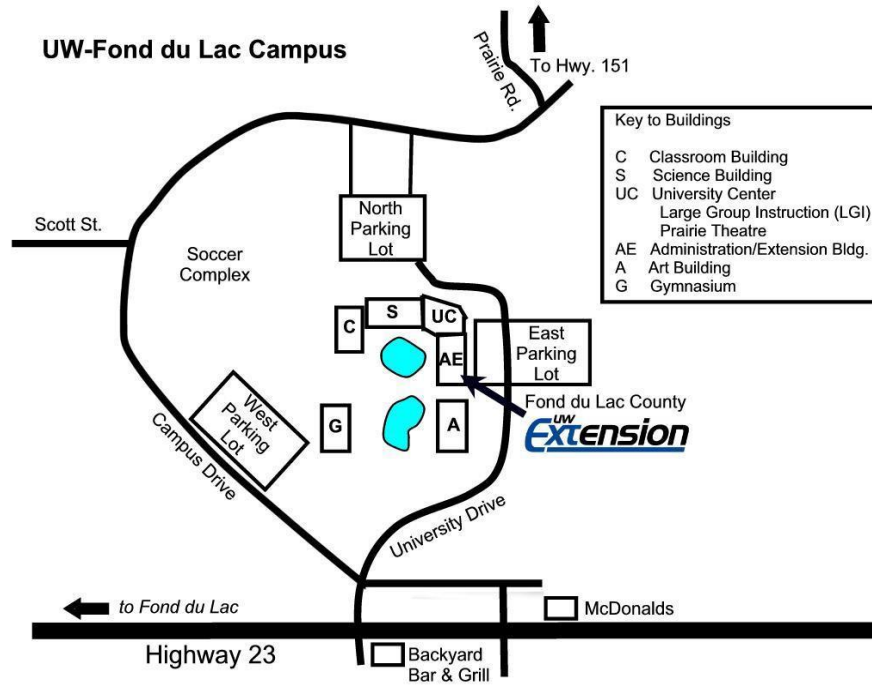
407 Drawing **Presenters: JoAnn Critchley and Machaia Rhoades**
